




HEESEN 38M NINA

What is it? A fully aluminium, semi-displacement 38m yacht from Heesen and Hot Lab with a top speed of 22 knots.

Why we love it This is one of the least obtrusive raised pilothouses we've seen yet. Thanks to Hot Lab's skilful exterior styling, you can barely see where the interior bridge blends into the "dual level" upper deck, as the designer has dubbed it. With naval architecture by Heesen, this yacht is a signature away from becoming a reality.



MOONSTONE

What is it?

The newest concept from Dutch builder Oceanco, 90 metre Moonstone has exteriors by Van Geest Design, with a cuttingedge lighting system by Temeloy Advanced Lighting Design.

Why we love it

Light technology can change the atmosphere of a yacht with the touch of a button, and Oceanco takes this to the next level with Moonstone, based on its 90m platform, which will be PYC classed. Designers Van Geest and light experts Temeloy worked hand-in-hand to create the faceted hull, which is designed to reflect water and light up so the hull itself glows.

BARRACUDA 120

What is it? Stefano Vafiadis penned this PYC-compliant 120m for an Italian yard.
Why we love it The low-profile, sleek lines of the Barracuda 120 are head-turning, while the PYC compliance affords plentiful accommodation for up to 22 guests and 34 crew. The upper deck is a VIP guest haven with a dedicated saloon and two 50m² VIP cabins, but the owner's panoramic deck outdoes it all. There are two massage rooms with glass walls facing the sea, so views are never far away.
