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Classic expression

Türkiye-based builder Numarine has revealed details of a new Classic superyacht line, beginning with two models, the 38XPC and 39MXPC.

Numarine is set to introduce a new Classic superyacht line, extending its established explorer DNA with a more refined and enduring design direction.

The concept reflects a shift in client demand, with increasing interest in yachts that balance capability with a more considered, timeless aesthetic.

Naval architect Umberto Tagliavini notes the approach reinterprets traditional yacht design through a contemporary lens, without compromising the technical foundations that define the brand. The exterior has been designed by Can Yalman, with interiors by Milan-based studio Hot Lab, part of the Viken Group.

For Yalman, the term Classic is not about revisiting the past, but about proportion, clarity and restraint – qualities that have long defined well-resolved yacht design. “The Classic Line emerged quite naturally from a period of reflection,” Yalman states.

“After years working on highly optimised, contemporary explorer yachts, there was a desire to reconnect with more timeless principles of naval design. At the same time, we sensed a growing desire

for this direction – a more balanced approach to yachting that moves away from excess and instead emphasises harmony, connection with nature and a more enduring idea of life at sea.”

Underpinning the new range is the same technical platform that defines Numarine’s explorer series. Both the 38XPC and 39MXPC are based on proven long-range hulls, retaining the yard’s focus on efficiency, seaworthiness, stability and autonomy.

“With the new Classic superyacht line, we’re proud to maintain the same core principles for which Numarine is known,” says Tagliavini. “These qualities are now expressed through a more timeless and architectural design language.”

The distinction between the two models lies in how that capability is experienced on board. The 39MXPC introduces a more open, social layout, with a reworked aft deck that incorporates a spa pool and expansive terrace close to the water, bringing a distinctly Mediterranean sensibility to the explorer platform. By contrast, the 38XPC takes a more restrained approach, drawing on the proportions and detailing of traditional gentleman’s yachts, with a focus on balance, elegance and a quieter onboard atmosphere.

“This Classic Line represents a natural evolution for Numarine,” asserts CEO Patrik von Sydow. “It allows us to broaden our design language and reach a wider audience, while staying true to the core principles that define the brand. In an industry often driven by fast-changing trends, the Classic Line offers a more enduring perspective – yachts designed not just for today, but for lasting relevance.”

Aura is the most lifestyle-focused interpretation, with a softer aesthetic and a relaxed onboard atmosphere centred on comfort and social living. Core sits closest to the original concept, balancing functionality with warmth. It is designed around family use, with more intimate spaces and features such as a main deck pantry and owner's balcony.

Infinite, by contrast, is the most capability-driven version, designed for extended exploration. It includes ice-class notation, a heli-deck, optional hybrid propulsion, increased tender and crane capacity, and expanded storage for water-sports equipment, alongside more open connections to the sea.

"From the outset, Petra was never intended to serve a single definition of ownership," says Cüneyt Okcu, Director of RMK Yachts. "Each version offers a different expression of life on board, allowing the yacht to reflect the identity of her owner." rmkyachts.com

Three times a lady

RMK Yachts has revealed Petra, a tri-vision superyacht series blending refined styling with long range and expedition-ready engineering.

Turkish shipyard RMK Yachts has unveiled Petra, a new 50-metre ocean-going explorer yacht concept developed in collaboration with Milan-based design studio Hot Lab, part of the Viken Group.

The partnership builds on a longstanding relationship between the two, with previous collaborations including the refit of the 45-metre *Keyla* – winner of the 2014 World Superyacht Award for Best Rebuilt Yacht – and the RMK 5000 Explorer concept.

Positioned as the yard's latest flagship concept, Petra draws on RMK Yachts' reputation for robust engineering and craftsmanship, while introducing a more lifestyle-led, versatile design approach.

"Our goal with Petra was to design a yacht that feels both timeless and deeply personal," offers Cem Taşdemir, Design Manager at RMK Yachts. "She's a vessel where architecture, light and space shape the experience of life on board."

Enrico Lumini, Partner and Design Director at Hot Lab, adds the design takes an

unconventional cue. "The inspiration came from the form of an anvil – its strength, precision and sculptural balance," he says. "From that, we developed the defining lines of the yacht, particularly the strong geometry of the stern's C profile."

Petra is offered in three distinct versions – Aura, Core and Infinite – each built on the same platform but tailored through different layouts, outfitting philosophies and exterior finishes.

"We believe a yacht should ultimately reflect the identity of her owner, and Petra was designed to let that identity find her own horizon."
